### De Stijl Series


As we do when we are on the phone, we pick up a pen and doodle.

blocks of red, blue, yellow and white. And so the De Stijl series was born. I'm sure Piet Mondrian will approve.








### Hypnotic Series

The hypnotic series started way back in 2007 with an exhibition entitled Hypnotic at World Art Gallery in Cape Town. The original series was painted in my standard primary and secondary colours and was received well.

In early 2016 I decided to paint over one of the existing works in gold and red to see if it worked. It did. I hung it in my house and it didn't hang for long.

I did two or three more which were also scooped up quickly, which was the trigger point for me to do a series. So what you see here is the first of this series released on exhibition to the public.

The paint I use is a metallic base which I then add my pigment to. The metallic base is the purest form of my paint I use.

### Studio Series

Each Studio Work is a 'piece of time' from my studio.

There is always a blank canvas in the studio which I doodle on and attach found items, from my everyday life, onto the canvas.

Experimenting and playing, looking for the next series. The objects can be an expired credit card, an Isle of Man number plate found on one of my journeys there. It can be a stub from Emirates flight to Dubai or a British airways silver card after been demoted to bronze for not travelling enough.

I buy my daughter Angelina's art and stick it on the artwork. Thus she can earn her own money and her art can live on in my art forever.

When I think the work is complete I paint one of my

icon images over the found objects.


I have created and sold over 27 pieces since 2008.

### **Bricks Series**

I sometimes stamp my name on my paintings more than once. While doing this one day way back in 2007, I stamped the entire canvas with the r-i-c-h-a-r-d stamp.

I remember selling them to a Swiss wine maker. I did not want to sell them, but at the time I thought I'd do another series in the future.

I did this, but, this time I decided to create a message in each work that relates to me and my daily thoughts and ideals. The four messages are:

1. Head north and make money: This is related to my travels to Johannesburg, Dubai and Europe as I head north, away from my family, and meet with existing and new collectors, and make money.



- 2. *Health, Wealth and Family*: This message is how I structure my life. If you keep fit and healthy you can work. If you work you can support your family. It seems a little selfish, but it's how I justify my working life.
- 3. **Don't miss a gear:** This I learnt from my good friend and business partner Andy Reid, of Vespa. Do things slowly, methodically and don't miss a gear and you will reach your destination.
- 4. *Missing the simple life*: This is a motto I often write on my studio works when I've committed to a deadline in the studio late at night. Unlike most academic artists, I run my life quite simply and don't work like a dog. So when I'm in that space I remind myself about the supposedly "simple life" I'm living.

### Construction Series

The construction series started when I demolished my house and built it up again in 2009. I was fortunate enough to have Rodrigo Pombero, a friend and Portuguese artist who was helping me build my house. Rodrigo would go around the building site and make cool sculptures out of found objects.

I decided to paint on one of the windows and a spade and the work were scooped up quickly.

I did a series on scaffolding planks and old demolished deck planks and sink-plaat roofing sheets.

The long wooden rusty nail piece you see here, hangs in my garden, and was the first piece I created.



The other two wooden scaffolding plank works are the last two from the building material I collected. If I do these in the future, I will have to source old building equipment.

I recently discussed doing a Township Series, using scrap sheeting from a township-shack, with my good friend Sefiso Mkhabela. I'm excited to explore this.




Construction Time Again 340 x 78 x 22cm
